

This is to help transposing chords in a song using the Interval chart below.

Important things to remember:

1. Know the interval/distance between the original key and the key you are transposing to.
2. Remember the extensions on the chord (maj7, min7, 7) always stay the same.
3. Make note of the starting note in the melody and which degree of the first chord it starts on.

Here's a couple of examples:

1. Let's say the song is in the key of Eb and the first 4 chords of the song are: Ebmaj7 Cm7 Fm7 Bb7

If I want to transpose up 1 step I would go to the Maj2nd column.

So in this example the new chords would be Fmaj7 Dm7 Gm7 and C7

If I want to transpose up a 5th I would go to the Perfect 5th column.

The new chords would be Bbmaj7 Gm7 Cm7 F7.

The more you do it the better you get at it!
